



On December 7, Pearl Harbor Day, George O'Daniel and members of Mena's Marine Corps League presented a framed news story about Herbert A. Littleton and a George Skypeck print to the Rich Mountain Community College Veterans Center. The news story details Herbert A. Littleton's life and incredible sacrifice during the Korean Conflict PFC. Hebert A. Littleton served with the Marine Corps Reserve during the Korean Conflict and was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor for sacrificing his life in order to protect the men in his company. Littleton is Mena's and Polk County's only Medal of Honor recipient. The George Skypeck action print depicts men engaged in battle from all branches of the military from the Civil War to the Viet Nam Conflict. Present to receive the prints were RMCC students and veterans Billy Orthman, Joel Presson, Daniel White, and Kenneth Griffin.
